



## Office Expectations

-There are a few requirements of the office and personal for In Office Moderate Sedation. These are fairly standard operating procedures found in most settings.

Profound local block anesthesia is the key to a successful sedation case. Pain is the #1 complication.

You must provide a full E-cylinder of Oxygen or have it plumbed into the operatory for use during sedation. The Oxygen cylinder I bring will be used in case of an emergency requiring such measures.

You must have a wheelchair available for the patient post operatively. If you do not have one, please inform me in advance so I can bring one.

In case of any issue during the sedation appointment, I will be in charge of instructing the Doctor and personal on what I would like them to be doing.

Two person CPR, and airway maintenance are the most common.

I will also ask that an assistant be available to help walk the patient to their care giver or car

This should be a very comfortable experience for the patient and the entire office.

If there are any issues, please don't hesitate to speak to me.

I will bring all emergency equipment and supplies, so there is no need to be concerned with this.
